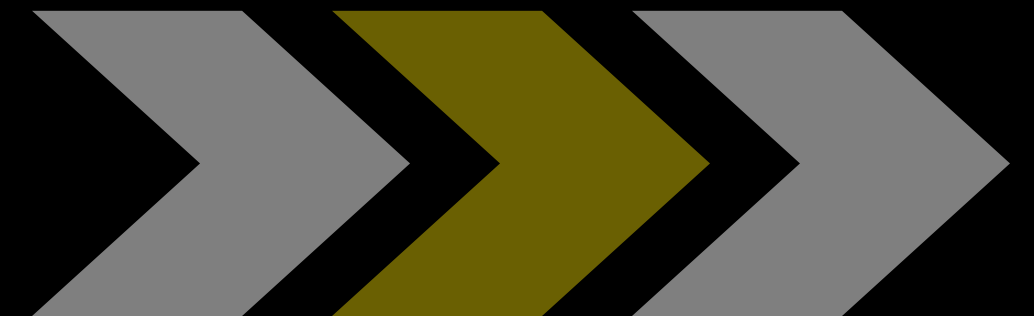

# SCHEDULES

## Reschedules

### U5-U9

- Under-5, Under-7, & Under-9 coaches may mutually agree to cancel a game, but the game will not be rescheduled.

### U11-U19

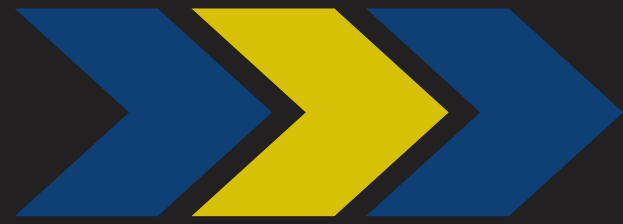
- The [form](#) (available on website) and applicable fee must be received in the SYSI office in accordance to the below timelines
  - **\$25 (10+ business days' notice)**
  - **\$50 (7-9 business days' notice)**



# FIELD START TIMES

## Game Length & Scheduled Start Times

- 50 minutes (25-min halves) – U11
  - 70 minutes (35-min halves) – U13
  - 80 minutes (40-min halves) – U15
  - 90 minutes (45-min halves) – U17 / U19
- Teams must vacate fields to allow for following games to proceed as scheduled. In the event of late kick-offs or other delays, time allocated for play will not be exceeded and the available playing time will be divided into two equal halves.
- This allows for any needed field set-up changes between bookings and allows the next booking to start on time.



## U5-U9 FIELD SET-UP

Please be advised all Under-5, Under-7, and Under-9 goals will be set up by the coaches of the first game taking place and taken down by the coaches of the last game each game day.

**Please see below for full instructions:**

### U5-U7:

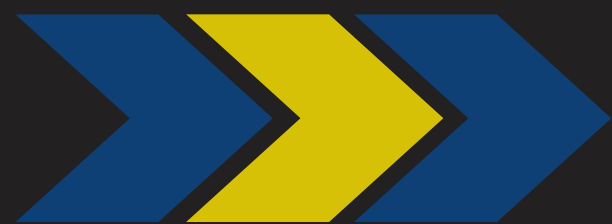
- Coaches are to grab a total of four flags and four bases from the flag storage area closest to their scheduled game.
- Flags/bases for goals shall be set up along the boards parallel to the curtains.
- Place flags for goal posts 10 – 12 feet apart. All curtains splitting the fields into thirds should be in place.

### U9:

- Coaches are to grab a total of two flags and two bases from the flag storage area closest to their scheduled game.
- Flags/bases for goals shall be placed against the curtain which is splitting the field in half. The other goal area is the hole in the wall.

### Last game of the day:

- Coaches from each team are to collect the bases and flags from their field and place the flags in the bin neatly and stack the bases on the floor.



# GREEN DROP MINI FOS

## SYSI Mini FOS (Festival of Soccer): U5-U9

- SYSI will be putting on festival on Fri Jun 5 - Sun Jun 7 at the Saskatoon Sports Centre.
- Each participant in the tournament will receive three **45-min games** and a medal
- The Green Drop Mini FOS fee is included in each team's outdoor season team fee, however, The entry fees are included in each team's indoor season fee.
- Zone Registrars and Community Coordinators must indicate to the SYSI office which teams will or will not be participating by the deadline of **Mon May 11.**
- Teams that cancel their entry after this date will forfeit their entire entry fee.
- Teams not fulfilling their entire tournament obligations (scheduled games) need to contact the office prior to the tournament so that the office may contact the other team.

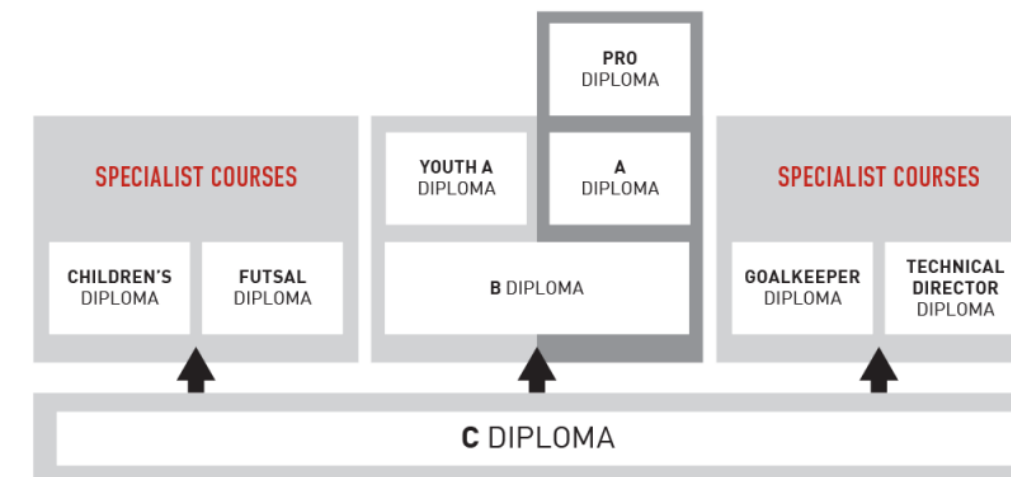

# TEAM PERSONNEL

## Certifications & Requirements

### Full Safe Sport Roster

Any individual who coaches a team (head, assistant, development coaches) that competes against a team outside of their home club, in this case SYSI (i.e. Zone or Community teams who take part in tournaments which involve competition against other SSA MO teams or out-of-province teams)

Any individual who coaches in either a Skill Centre or Dedicated player program is required to meet the standards of the full Safe Sport Roster, this includes but is not limited to the Alliance Academy coaches and those coaching the Zone Skill Centre or Dedicated player program sessions.

- Requirements for U7-U19 teams who ARE entering zone tournaments or out-of-town tournaments and Dedicated Player or Skill Centre Coaches.

### Modified Safe Sport Roster

Any individual who coaches a team that competes only against teams within their own club (i.e. Zone or Community teams only play other SYSI member Zone or Community teams and do not take part in tournaments which involve competition against other SSA MO teams or out-of-province teams - Mini FOS would be exempt because it is a tournament solely for SYSI member teams and no other SSA member teams are accepted).

- Requirements for U5-U19 teams who are NOT entering zone tournaments or out-of-town tournaments other than U5-U9 FOS/SISCO

## Certifications & Requirements - Optional but Highly Recommended

- **Keeping Girls In Sport Training** (\$17 ~ Online Learning)
  - Highly encouraged for those coaching coed or female teams.
- **Aboriginal Coaching Modules** (Free)
  - its content reflects the uniqueness of Indigenous cultures, values, and lifestyles and is rolled out in three modules.
- **Commit To Kids** (\$12 ~ Online Learning)
  - The Commit to Kids (C2K) for Coaches online training empowers coaches with practical information to help them enhance child and youth safety in sport. It highlights the importance of understanding boundaries, sexual misconduct and reporting inappropriate behaviour.





# TEAM PERSONNEL

## Certifications & Requirements - Optional but Highly Recommended

- **Coaching Athletes with a Disability** \$15 - An eLearning module to diversify your coaching portfolio. The module provides the knowledge to deliver quality, positive sport experiences for athletes, specifically those with behavioural, intellectual, physical, and sensory disabilities. A resource for coaches who are new to coaching athletes with a disability. Many coaches who are already working with athletes with a disability will also find the module useful. This module will prepare you to develop inclusive sport experiences and to communicate effectively and respectfully with and about persons with a disability.
- **Bystander Empowerment** Free - SYSI highly recommends volunteers and/or parents complete this training. After completing the Bystander Empowerment eLearning module, you will be able to: Recognize different forms of violence; Identify helpful and hurtful bystander behaviour; Use strategies to intervene as a bystander in situations of violence. This eLearning will take approximately 20 to 30 minutes
- **Respect in Sport training for Parents** \$12 - SYSI highly recommends ALL parents complete this training. Takes 1 hour to complete at your own pace. One of the most common reasons coaches, managers, officials and athletes, of all ages, cite for leaving sport is unacceptable parent behaviour. The Respect in Sport Parent Program will help define a standard of behaviour for all parents and create a more rewarding, safe and respectful environment for everyone involved. Parents want to do a great job supporting their kids. Respect in Sport provides parents with the tools to create and maintain Safe Sport environments. ## Codes of Conduct

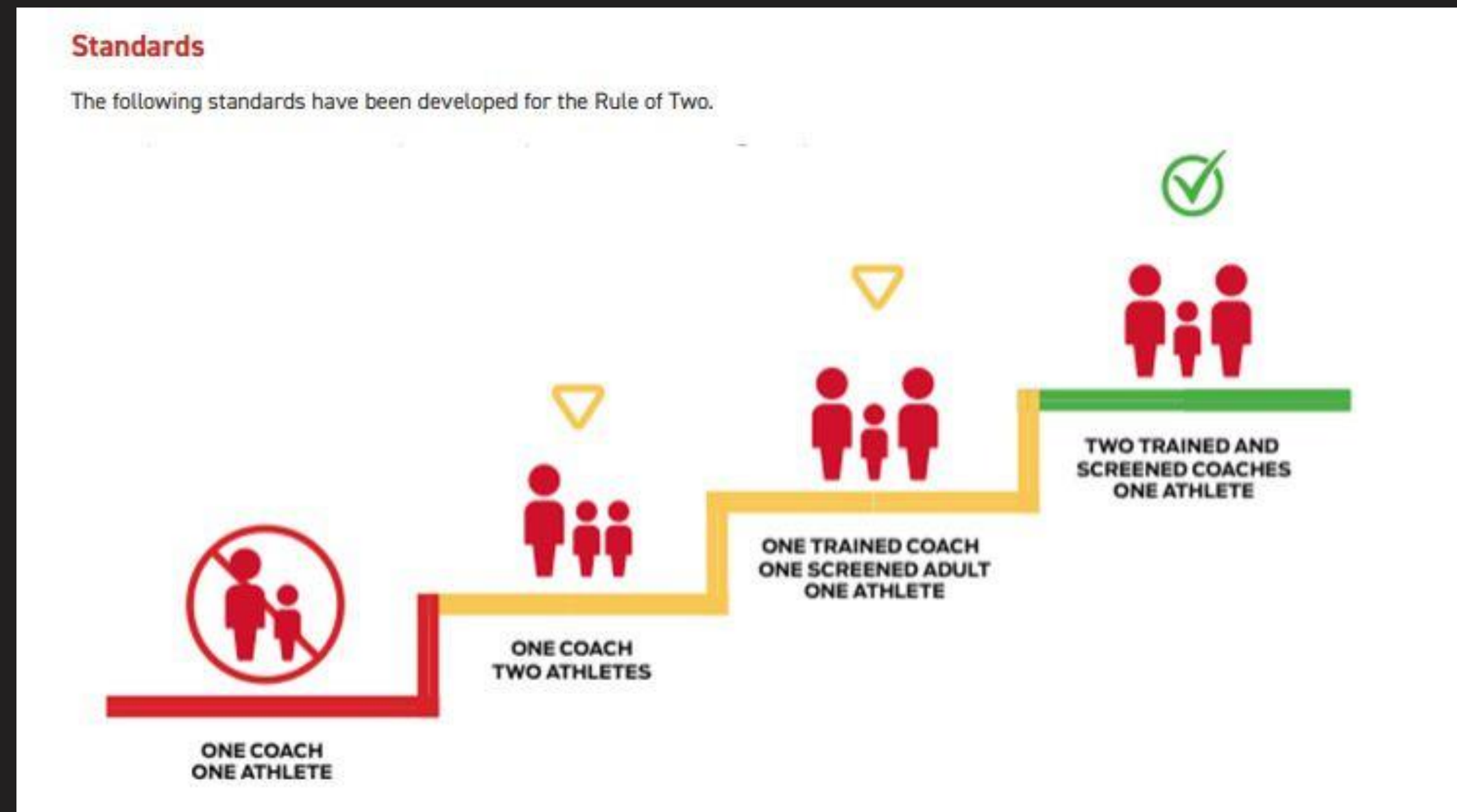

# PLAYER SAFETY

## Rule of Two

- The Rule of Two serves to protect minor athletes in potentially vulnerable situations by ensuring that more than one adult is present
- The Rule of Two states that there will always be two screened and Respect in Sport and NCCP trained or certified coaches with an athlete, especially a minor athlete, when in a potentially vulnerable situation





# PLAYER SAFETY

## Guidelines for Interacting with Children & Adolescents

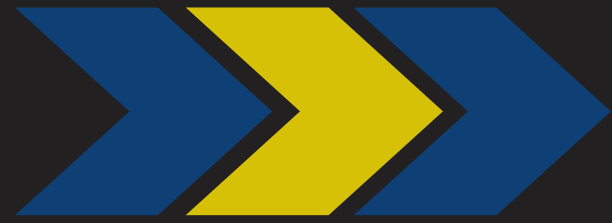
- When taking on the responsibilities of the role of the coach, you are also taking on a position of trust for the athlete.
- This trust is built on boundaries of professionalism inherent in the coach and athlete relationship.
- The responsibility of maintaining the professional relationship and appropriate boundaries is always with the adult.

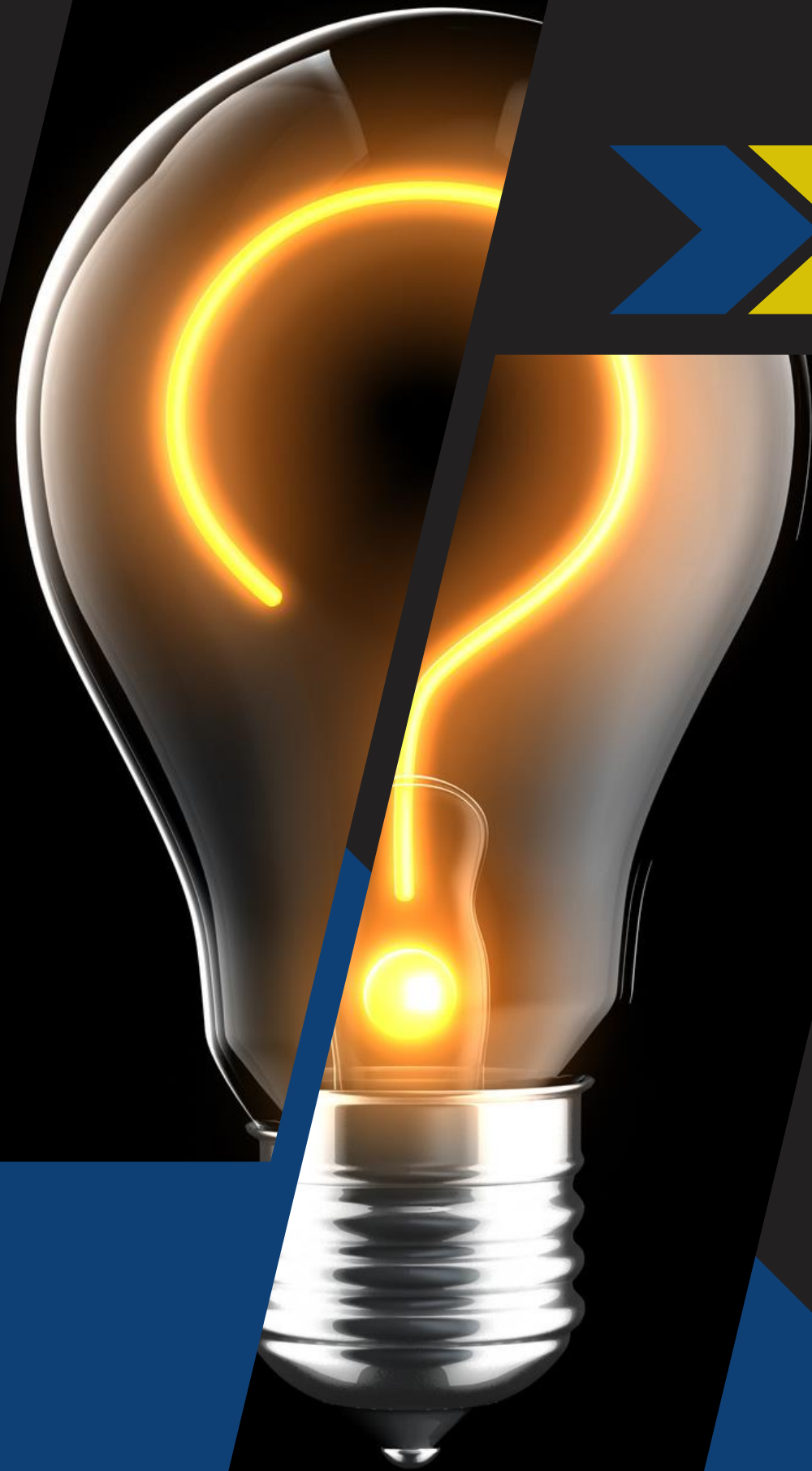


# RULES OF SOCCER CENTRES

(SSC & SKHRSC)

- The Saskatoon Sports Centre and Saskatoon Kinsmen / Henk Ruys Soccer Centre have been around well over 20 years (Henk since 1998, SSC since 2005). These fabulous facilities have been recognized as some of the best in Canada! We should all be very proud of those who have made this a reality.
- The staff of SSCI strive to ensure that all facility users have a fun and safe experience. To achieve this goal, we ask that you share the following rules with all parents, assistant coaches, and players:
  - **Clean footwear** must be worn – free of mud and dirt, when entering all fields. Outdoor shoes or Metal cleats are not allowed on the fields.
  - **No changing on the fields** – use the assigned dressing rooms to change and store belongings
  - Spectators are to view games from **designated spectator areas** only
  - Food, sunflower seeds, sugared drinks, or **gum** are **not allowed** on the fields
  - **No outside Food or Drink permitted**
  - Only appropriate bottles with water are allowed on the fields, **no glass**
  - There is zero tolerance for **violence or abusive and foul language** directed at anyone in or around SSCI facilities
  - **Spitting is prohibited** indoors and outdoors on all Saskatoon Soccer Centre premises. Individuals caught spitting will be immediately evicted

# REFEREES

## Referees (U11-U19)

- **No Referee** – Games without a referee for whatever reason, must get played or both teams forfeit. If a referee does not show up, the HOME TEAM will drop the game sheet in the black box, located on the wall (next to the white board) by the Soccer Centre Admissions desk.
- **Field Marshall Program ~ Not Mandatory, but strongly encouraged** – Each team in U11-U19 is encouraged to assign a parent volunteer Field Marshall. The goal of the Field Marshall program is to have a parent volunteer alleviate any spectators from abusing referees.
  - Parent field marshals are encouraged to take the free online module [Bystander Empowerment](#).
- **Mentorship** – SYSI encourages all teams to fill out the [online Referee Evaluation Form](#) to help us continue to help develop our officials.

# GAME SHEETS

## Game Sheet Procedures (U11-U19)

- It is the responsibility of the Home team to collect the game sheet at the Saskatoon Sports Centre admissions or Henk Ruys Soccer Centre admissions prior to the game. If a referee does not show up, the HOME TEAM will drop the game sheet in the black box, located on the wall (next to the white board) by the Soccer Centre Admissions desk.
- The game sheet & game score should be provided to the SYSI office by the referee within 48 hours of the game (not always the case - so please be patient).  
**Teams should take a photo of the game sheet in the event SYSI requests a copy.**



# GAME SHEET INFRACTIONS

## Game Sheet Procedures (U11-U19)

- Please review section 14.0 Game Sheets of the [SYSI General Operating Rules and Regulations](#)
- Team personnel must review the game sheet prior to the start of the game and ensure the game sheet is accurate;
- The following chart is the SYSI game sheet infractions guideline. The chart lists minimum actions that will be imposed; however, the SYSI office may impose an alternate penalty.

Infraction	Overturning of Game	Performance Fine
Exceeded number of permit players allowed on game sheet ( <i>Permit Players rules 13.4.4, 13.4.5, 13.4.14, 13.4.15</i> )	<b>Yes</b> – This infraction results in the game being overturned and a default loss for the team.	1 <sup>st</sup> offense \$50
Players laterally permitted on the game sheet ( <i>Permit Players rule 13.4</i> )		Each additional offense \$100 with potential suspension and further discipline of team personnel and/or zone ( <i>discipline rule 17.11</i> ).
Overage players permitted or listed on the game sheet without granted approval by SYSI ( <i>Age Groups rules 3.7 – 3.10 and Permit Players rule 13.4</i> )		
Non-registered players or team personnel listed on game sheet ( <i>Team Registration and Player Affiliation rule 10.6 and Player Eligibility rule 15.1</i> )		
Suspended players or team personnel listed on game sheet and not crossed out while serving suspension ( <i>Caution and Ejections rule 16.8</i> )		
Failure to cross off players or team personnel on the game sheet that is not present at the game ( <i>Game Sheets rule 14.2</i> )	<b>No</b> – This infraction does not result in a game being overturned.	1 <sup>st</sup> offense warning
Failure to place a “P” next to permit players on the game sheet ( <i>Game Sheets rule 14.2</i> )		2 <sup>nd</sup> offense \$50
Failure to designate a gender rep on the bench/gamesheet		Each additional offense \$100
Failure to list full player names on the game sheet; ie: listing number only and no player name ( <i>Game Sheets rule 14.2</i> )		
Failure to list accurate jersey numbers next to each player on the game sheet ( <i>Game Sheets rule 14.2</i> )

# Player or Coach Ejections

- A player or coach who is ejected from a game either through two **yellow** cards or a **red** card are to leave the field of play immediately.
- Failure to leave the bench and field immediately results in much harsher suspensions.
- Teams are to ensure they have two registered and screened volunteers, in addition to the coaching staff, who can escort the player to the commons area, where a parent/guardian shall meet them, or have the screened volunteers wait with the player in the commons area until the completion of the game.



# 5 UP - 1 UP RULE

5 up - 1 up (U5 - U11)

- **5 up – 1 up (under-5 through under-11):**
  - If the game gets to a 5-goal differential, the trailing team can add a player, and every 3 goals after, you can add an additional player up to a maximum of 3 additional players. If the score goes under the 5-goal differential, the additional player must be removed.
